SEASONAL SAFETY

November-December is a time when shopping skyrockets, families gather, parties are scheduled, and travel spikes. ADT wants to make sure you stay safe both inside and outside your home!

SHOPPING

Conceal Your Purchases. Nothing gets a thief going like a car full of bags that are clearly visible. Lock them in your trunk or place them under seats out of sight. Criminals watch and break in to steal the items when you return to the store or mall. After making purchases, go directly home to secure your items.

Protect Yourself. Women should carry their purses close to their body and men should keep their wallets in their front pocket or in a coat pocket to deter pickpockets. Also, shop in groups if possible and watch for loiterers near and around your vehicle.

Parking Lot Safety. Anticipate minimal parking availability. Avoid carrying large amounts of cash. When returning to your car, stop, listen, and look around. Stay alert to your surroundings and have your car keys readily available before you get to your vehicle.

FAMILY GATHERINGS AND PARTIES

Increased use of candles and fireplaces, combined with an increase in the amount of combustible, seasonal decorations present in many homes means more risk for fire. Never leave a fire burning unattended. Make sure to supervise children and pets around any open flames. A monitored smoke or heat detector will send a signal even if your security system is not armed. The holidays are time when you may have guests staying in your home. Make sure areas have night lights or easy-to-reach lamps in case they need to get up during the night. You may also want to consider motion sensor night lights which automatically turn on in the dark when movement is detected.

TRAVEL TIPS

When traveling by car, the driver and all passengers should always wear seatbelts. Remember not to text while driving. If driving long distances, take breaks every 2-3 hours to remain alert and focused.

Update your contacts with ADT. That way, if signals are received from your home, we have the most reliable means of reaching you (or your authorized contact).



PET SAFETY

Pet safety is nothing to take lightly. Every 90 seconds a home fire starts Monitored smoke detectors along with pet somewhere in the nation. monitoring systems are perfect for keeping track of your pets while you are away. If you get a call from ADT that there is a disturbance in your home or if your monitored smoke detectors have detected smoke, simply view your home camera footage live on ADT's Pulse App with your smart device or computer.



ADT's Pulse® cameras can keep an eye on your pets when you're not home. You'll know if your pets are in any immediate danger. You can also find out if they're getting into mischief, or discover if your pets really do have a secret life!

PREVENT CARBON MONOXIDE POISONING

Carbon monoxide (CO) is a colorless, odorless deadly gas and can only be identified by a detection device. Because you can't see, taste, or smell it, carbon monoxide can kill you before you know it's there. ADT Security urges everyone to be aware of the risks of carbon monoxide poisoning and take every precaution to protect our communities, homes, and families. This is particularly important with today's quiet and keyless cars and smart phone apps that start your car! It is especially important in connected units like townhomes and villas.

Where is CO found?

Sources of carbon monoxide can be a car accidentally left running in a garage or a running generator placed too close to the home. Many household items including gas and oil-burning furnaces, wood burning fireplaces, and charcoal grills produce this poison gas. NEVER run a car or truck in a garage with the garage door shut. NEVER use a generator indoors or in a garage, carport, or basement. CO from these sources can quickly build up to lethal levels in enclosed or semi-enclosed spaces.



All people and animals are at risk for CO poisoning. The CDC reports that each year, more than 400 Americans die from unintentional CO poisoning, more than 20,000 visit the emergency room and more than 4,000 are hospitalized due to CO poisoning. Fatality is highest among Americans 65 and older.

Can I just buy a CO detector at the store?

- Although an unmonitored carbon monoxide detector should sound when unsafe levels of CO are detected, you must be able to react to the danger. In the case of carbon monoxide CAN'T BE poisoning, response time is critical.
- By adding a monitored CO detector to your existing security system, ADT Security's company-owned Monitoring Centers are able to monitor your carbon monoxide detectors 24/7 and dispatch help to your home in case of alarm. This is especially critical in connected units like townhomes or villas.
